FALSE PROPHETS, TRUE PROPHETS

In Deuteronomy today we hear that God's very words will fill the mouth of a true prophet, but a false prophet will, in a manner of speaking, put mere mortal words into God's mouth. In Mark's Gospel, we see Jesus teaching and healing as a true prophet, one filled with the authority of God's own voice, the Holy One of God.

The whole history of our church is filled with both true and false prophets. But in today's Gospel we learn that Jesus' fame spread because he taught with authority; he wasn't an authority because he was popular or famous. We also learn from him, in his desert temptation confrontations with Satan, that anyone can quote scripture, even against God's purposes. And today we hear that his authority was not like that of the scribes, who held the official positions of religious authority in his day. Our work is to do our best to discern the true prophets in our midst, and to be true prophets as well. The psalmist tells us how to do this: by not hardening our hearts when God speaks. If we truly listen to God, it will be God's very words filling our mouths. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

A Message from our Pastor Fr. Tim Freyer

Thank you to all who have made their pledge to the Pastoral Services Appeal (PSA) today or those who pledged online. Again, our share of the diocesan ministries is \$138,000. Everything that we give beyond that is returned to our parish for our needs. The future needs we would like to address are:

- Refurnishing the pews and replacing the kneelers in the church.
- Replacing the flooring and restrooms in the annex building.
- Replacing the roof in the old school building.

Remember that you have 10 months to fulfill your pledge. If you have not pledged before please consider giving one or two dollars a day (\$300 or \$600 over 10 months).

Many have asked about the decorations from the Lunar New Year celebration last weekend. The image is of the Vietnamese Martyrs. Wikipedia has this brief history of the Martyrs:

The Vatican estimates the number of Vietnamese martyrs at between 130,000 and 300,000. John Paul II decided to canonize those whose names are known and unknown, giving them a single feast day.

The Vietnamese Martyrs fall into several groupings, those of the Dominican and Jesuit missionary era of the 17th century, those killed in the politically inspired persecutions of the 19th century, and those martyred during the Communist purges of the 20th century. A representative sample of only 117 martyrs — including 96 Vietnamese, 11 Spanish Dominicans, and 10 French members of the Paris Foreign Missions Society (Missions Etrangères de Paris (MEP)) — were beatified on four separate occasions: 64 by Pope Leo XIII on May 27, 1900, eight by Pope Pius X on May 20, 1906, 20 by Pope Pius X on May 2, 1909, 25 by Pope Pius XII on April 29, 1951.[citation needed] All these 117 Vietnamese Martyrs were canonized on June 19, 1988. A young Vietnamese Martyr, Andrew Phú Yên, was beatified in March, 2000 by Pope John Paul II.

Vietnamese martyrs Paul Mi, Pierre Duong, Pierre Truat, martyred on December 18, 1838. The tortures these individuals underwent are considered by the Vatican to be among the worst in the history of Christian martyrdom. The torturers hacked off limbs joint by joint, tore flesh with red hot tongs, and used drugs to enslave the minds of the victims. Christians at the time were branded on the face with the words "ta dao" (左道, lit. "Left (Perverse) religion")[1] and families and villages which subscribed to Christianity were obliterated.

De nuevo, nuestra cuota para los ministerios diocesanos es de \$138,000. Todo lo que demos que sobrepase esta cantidad se regresará a nuestra parroquia para nuestras necesidades. Las necesidades futuras que quisieramos cubrir son:

- Renovar las bancas y reemplazar los reclinatorios en la iglesia.
- Reemplazar los pisos y los baños en el edificio anexo.
- Reemplazar el techo del antiguo edificio de la escuela.

Recuerden que tendrán diez meses para cumplir su promesa. Si anteriormente no han hecho una por favor consideren dar uno o dos dólares por día (\$300 o \$600 en diez meses).

Muchos me han preguntado sobre las decoraciones de la celebración del Nuevo Año Lunar del fin de semana pasado. La imagen es de los Mártires Vietnamitas. Wikipedia tiene una breve historia de los Mártires:

El Vaticano estima que el número de mártires Vietnamitas está de entre 130,000 a 300,000. Juan Pablo II decidió canonizar a aquellos de nombres conocidos y desconocidos, dándoles un día festivo.

Los Mártires Vietnamitas están en varios grupos, aquellos de la era de los misioneros Dominicos y Jesuitas del siglo 17, aquellos asesinados durante la persecución política del siglo 19, y aquellos martirizados durante la eliminación Comunista del siglo 20. Un ejemplo representativo de solamente 117 mártires - incluyendo 96 Vietnamitas, 11 Dominicos Españoles, y 10 miembros Franceses de la Sociedad Misionera Extranjera de Paris (Missions Etrangères de Paris (MEP)) — fueron beatificados en cuatro diferentes ocasiones: 64 por el Papa Leo XIII el 27 de mayo, 1900, 8 por el Papa Pío X el 20 de mayo, 1906, 20 por el Papa Pío X el 2 de mayo, 1909, 25 por el Papa Pío XII el 29 de mayo, 1951. [citación requerida] Todos estos 117 Mártires Vietnamitas fueron canonizados el 19 de junio, 1988. Un joven Mártir Vietnamita, Andrew Phú Yên, fue beatificado en marzo del 2000 por el Papa Juan Pablo II.

Los mártires Vietnamitas Paul Mi, Pierre Duong, Pierre Truat, fueron martirizados el 18 de diciembre de 1838. Las torturas que estos individuos sufrieron son considerados por el Vaticano como los peores en la historia del martirio Cristiano. Los torturadores cortaban las extremidades coyuntura por coyuntura, rasgaban la piel con tenazas calientes, y usaban drogas para esclavizar las mentes de las víctimas. Los Cristianos de ese tiempo eran marcados en la frente con las palabras "ta dao" (左道, lit. "Religión de izquierda (Perversa)") [1] y las familias y pueblos que se inscribían a la Cristiandad eran eliminados.

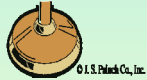

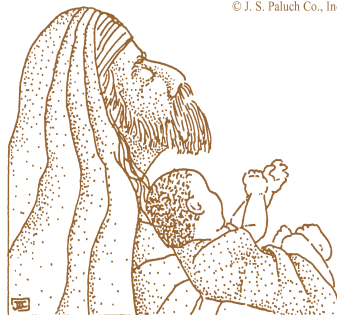

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Forty days after Christmas, this week’s ancient feast of the Presentation of the Lord is an extension of the shining days of Christ’s coming into the depths of winter. This is the day when, for a thousand years, the Church has blessed a year’s supply of candles. In many places, a procession forms outside the church. The core memory is of Simeon and Anna’s meeting with the infant Jesus and his parents outside the temple on the fortieth day after the child’s birth, and the delight of going to the table of the Lord for the Eucharist, a foretaste of our final meeting with Christ.

For some Christians, today is known as “The Meeting,” suggesting not only the encounter in the temple, but also our assembly at the Lord’s table and our longing for the kingdom. One story suggests that the commotion made by so many candle-bearing, hymn-singing faithful in the wintry fields of Germany on their joyful way to Mass stirred the badger from hibernation to examine this promise of springtime. The interrupted nap of the groundhog is amazingly linked to the light of Christ driving away the shadows of the world’s darkness. This beautiful feast only rarely falls on a Sunday. TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

El día 2 de febrero se celebrará la Candelaria. En este día se conmemora la purificación de María, cuarenta días después de que dio a luz a Jesús. Candelaria viene del verbo latín candere (brillar), de allí la palabra candelera, o sea, veladora. La celebración de

la Purificación de María y la Presentación del Niño Jesús en el templo se conmemora con la bendición de todas las velas y veladoras que se van a usar durante el año. Esto se hace con la esperanza de que nunca venga a faltar la luz, tanto material como espiritual, en las casas de los fieles. Los cristianos, como Simeón en el templo, pueden decir que ellos también han visto la salvación; Jesús la verdadera luz que brilla en brazos de María.

En Puerto Rico tradicionalmente esta fiesta se celebra con la quemazón de los árboles de navidad, basura, palos, cosas viejas, etc. Esta costumbre subraya el deseo de dejar atrás todo lo malo para que llegue lo bueno; es decir terminar con la oscuridad para que brille la luz.
